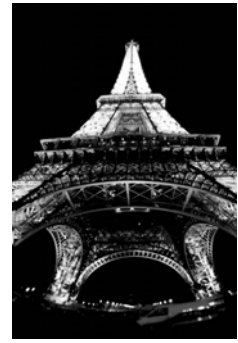


Comparative Politics (GL 261)
